Dear Hardyeans,

We are at the mid-point of the school year, and the crocuses (croci?) are out in front of the main building. As the sap rises, spirits lift... for students as much as for staff, and the end of a long winter seems a realistic possibility. The extreme weather has a real impact on the running of the school, never more so than when an early January storm took several tiles of the roof of the communications block, leading to a large area having to be cordoned off while safety works were completed. Other than such excitement, our students continue to represent the school, home and away, with great distinction. I say 'away' as the annual science trip to Florida ran over the recent half-term break, although they had their own excitement when a three-hour delay on the M25 meant that they missed their flight. On the understanding that the chances of there being another flight to Florida with over 50 free seats were surely zero, plans were drawn up for how to contact parents and deal with the inevitable despair and anguish from the disappointed crew. 

From Cadet to Second Lieutenant

Or the 15th of December 2023, former THS student, Lauren O'Toole, commissioned from the Royal Military Academy Sandhurst as a Second Lieutenant into the British Army. Lauren was a student from 2013 - 2018, and a cadet in the school's Combined Cadet Force. A commission from Sandhurst is earned through an arduous year of training, which includes field exercises, war studies, physical training, the bayonet lane, drill, marksmanship and a significant lack of sleep. It is a challenging but enjoyable year, with strong friendships formed through the unique shared suffering of sitting in muddy holes together at 3am, after days of little sleep. Personal highlights for Lauren included a 60km navigation exercise through the Black Mountains called Exercise Long Reach, practising riot control on Exercise Templar's Triumph, and the camaraderie with her fellow Officer Cadets.

The main event on the day of commissioning is the Sovereign's Parade. Lauren was a member of the Sovereign's

Platoon, which is the title awarded to the best platoon of the intake, determined by a competition that runs throughout the year consisting of physical and academic events. Lauren was given the honour of being the ensign to the Sovereign's Banner, which is the task of accepting and carrying the Sovereign's Banner throughout the parade. Thanks to many early morning rehearsals, the parade went well. It was a day filled with joy, pride, and relief! Lauren said, "I never would have considered the Army as an option had it not been for going along to the CCF BBQ for some free food at the start of year 9, and had no idea of the incredible opportunities it would present to me. I am greatly looking forward to what comes next, as I begin my career as a young officer in the Education and Training Services".
